- Commitment to comply with all applicable Acts, Regulations and Standards;
- All employees and contractors are provided with sufficient information to enable them to understand their obligations in relation to this policy;
- This safety, health and environment policy is reviewed periodically to take account of any new legislation and organizational changes.

In fulfilling the objectives of this policy, management is committed to regular consultation with employees to ensure that the policy operates effectively and safety, health and environmental issues are regularly reviewed.
